NOTES FROM MICHAEL

Recently I read an interview with President Obama where he said one of his favorite quotes is from Justice Louis Brandeis. The Justice said that the most important political office is that of the private citizen. The president went on to say that what Justice Brandeis meant was that every citizen has the responsibility to maintain democracy, that unless citizens force their political leaders to do the right thing for the good of democracy, those leaders will always do the thing which is most politically expedient.

We can push our political leaders by voting but almost as importantly by letting them know how we feel about legislation that they will be voting on. I was at the June 22 St. Petersburg City Council meeting on the ordinances submitted by Council Chair Darden Rice to keep super PAC money out of the city's political campaigns, as each councilmember spoke they mentioned how much their vote was based on the number of calls and emails they had received from their constituents. That is just one example of how important it is to let our elected representatives know how we feel. If we want to keep our democracy alive and well, this is vitally important.

Anticipated Timeline of the 2017-2018 Constitution Revision Commission

February 2017: 2017-2018 Constitution Revision Commission named.

2017 Legislative Session: Appropriations for Commission's work.

March 2017: 2017-2018 Constitution Revision Commission begins work.

November 2018: Citizens vote on proposals.
